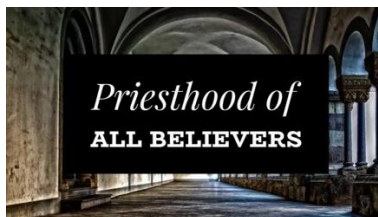

Children’s Message – Pastor Peter

(Following the Children’s message, children in third grade and below are invited to depart for Children’s Worship downstairs in Carmel Hall.)

Unison Prayer for Illumination (In unison) –

As you spoke to the early disciples, O God, speak now to each of us as we seek to serve you and one another. By your Spirit, let your word illumine the darkness, and your light breaks into our lives so that we may see and live your truth. Amen.

First Reading –

The first reading is Exodus, chapter 19, verses 1-6; p. 63). We hear of the arrival at Mount Sinai and God’s word that Israel shall become a nation of priests and a holy nation. Listen now for the Word of God to you!

On exactly the third-month anniversary of the Israelites’ leaving the land of Egypt, they came into the Sinai desert. They traveled from Rephidim, came into the Sinai desert, and set up camp there. Israel camped there in front of the mountain while Moses went up to God. The Lord called to him from the mountain, “This is what you should say to Jacob’s household and declare to the Israelites: You saw what I did to the Egyptians, and how I lifted you up on eagles’ wings and brought you to me. So now, if you faithfully obey me and stay true to my covenant, you will be my most precious possession out of all the peoples, since the whole earth belongs to me. You will be a kingdom of priests for me and a holy nation. These are the words you should say to the Israelites.”

This is the Word of the Lord!

New Testament Reading –

The second reading is 1 Peter, chapter 2, verses 4-10; p. 219. We hear of an appeal for holiness, where God’s people will be a spiritual house built of living stones and a holy priesthood offering spiritual sacrifices. Listen now for the word of God to you!

Now you are coming to him as to a living stone. Even though this stone was rejected by humans, from God's perspective it is chosen, valuable. You yourselves are being built like living stones into a spiritual temple. You are being made into a holy priesthood to offer up spiritual sacrifices that are acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. Thus it is written in scripture, *Look! I am laying a cornerstone in Zion, chosen, valuable. The person who believes in him will never be shamed.* So God honors you who believe. For those who refuse to believe, though, the stone the builders tossed aside has become the capstone. This is a stone that makes people stumble and a rock that makes them fall. Because they refuse to believe in the word, they stumble. Indeed, this is the end to which they were appointed. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people who are God's own possession. You have become this people so that you may speak of the wonderful acts of the one who called you out of darkness into his amazing light. Once you weren't a people, but now you are God's people. Once you hadn't received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

This is the Word of the Lord.

New Testament Gospel Reading –

The gospel reading from the lectionary is Luke, chapter 17, verses 11-19; p. 75. Jesus heals ten people with leprosy; only one returns to give thanks. Listen now for the Word of God to you!

On the way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered a village, ten men with skin diseases approached him. Keeping their distance from him, they raised their voices and said, "Jesus, Master, show us mercy!"

When Jesus saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." As they left, they were cleansed. One of them, when he saw that he had been healed, returned and praised God with a loud voice. He fell on his face at Jesus' feet and thanked him. He was a Samaritan. Jesus replied, "Weren't ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? No one returned to praise God except this foreigner?" Then Jesus said to him, "Get up and go. Your faith has healed you."






