#### **Old Testament Reading**

The first reading from the lectionary is Isaiah, chapter 63, verses 6-12; p. 651. Salvation comes; Jerusalem is restored; the people are redeemed. Listen now for the Word of God to you!

Upon your walls, Jerusalem, I have appointed sentinels. Continually, all day and all night, they won't keep silent. You who call on the Lord, don't rest, and don't allow God to rest until he establishes Jerusalem. and makes it the praise of the earth. The Lord has promised with raised hand and strong arm: I will never again give your grain as food for your enemies. Foreigners won't drink your wine for which you labored. Those who harvest will eat it and will praise the Lord; those who gather will drink it in my holy courtyards.

#### **New Testament Reading**

The second reading from the lectionary is Titus, chapter 3, verses 4-7; p. 203. We are justified by the grace of Christ, reborn in the Holy Spirit. Listen now for the word of God to you!

But "when God our savior's kindness and love appeared, he saved us because of his mercy, not because of righteous things we had done. He did it through the washing of new birth and the renewing by the Holy Spirit, which God poured out upon us generously through Jesus Christ our savior. So, since we have been made righteous by his grace, we can inherit the hope for eternal life."

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. *This is the Word of the Lord.*

#### **New Testament Gospel Reading**

The gospel reading is Luke, chapter 2, verses 1-20; p. 54-55. To you is born this day a Savior, the Messiah, the Lord. Listen now for the Word of God to you!

In those days Caesar Augustus declared that everyone throughout the empire should be enrolled in the tax lists. This first enrollment occurred when Quirinius governed Syria. Everyone went to their own cities to be enrolled. Since Joseph belonged to David's house and family line, he went up from the city of Nazareth in Galilee to David's city, called Bethlehem, in Judea. He went to be enrolled together with Mary, who was promised to him in marriage and who was pregnant. While they were there, the time came for Mary to have her baby. She gave birth to her firstborn child, a son, wrapped him snugly, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the guestroom.

Nearby shepherds were living in the fields, guarding their sheep at night. The Lord's angel stood before them, the Lord's glory shone around them, and they were terrified.

The angel said, "Don't be afraid! Look! I bring good news to you—wonderful, joyous news for all people. Your savior is born today in David's city. He is Christ the Lord. This is a sign for you: you will find a newborn baby wrapped snugly and lying in a manger." Suddenly a great assembly of the heavenly forces was with the angel praising God. They said, "Glory to God in heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors."

When the angels returned to heaven, the shepherds said to each other, "Let's go right now to Bethlehem and see what's happened. Let's confirm what the Lord has revealed to us." They went quickly and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. When they saw this, they reported what they had been told about this child. Everyone who heard it was amazed at what the shepherds told them. Mary committed these things to memory and considered them carefully. The shepherds returned home, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen. Everything happened just as they had been told.
